Penguin Class has had a very busy term. They have been learning about the Stone Age and had a go at designing some Stone Age tools and jewellery.

In maths they have been looking at place value, and revising adding in 1s and 10s. In English they have been practising writing in full sentences, especially when answering questions and they have learnt about different parts of the skeleton for Science.

In maths, they've developed their understanding of place value and are now confidently adding and subtracting up to 4 digit numbers.
